

At Verona Area International School, our mission is to educate Global Citizens: to prepare children for the demands and responsibilities of Global Citizenship by providing the knowledge, skills, and experience needed to move naturally between different languages and cultures. Our school is a Chinese immersion school with 50% of the curriculum delivered in Mandarin. It is the only Chinese immersion school in the state of Wisconsin. Students spend half their school day learning in Mandarin, the number one spoken language in the world. Our kindergarten students immediately begin hearing Mandarin during half of their school day. The curriculum meets common core standards and test scores demonstrate that students are able to excel in all subject areas while in an immersion environment.

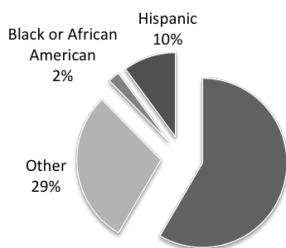

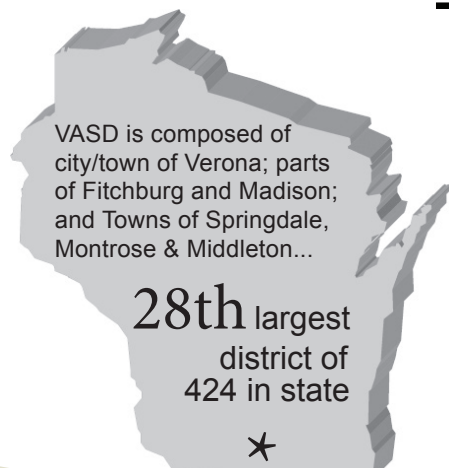
School Demographics

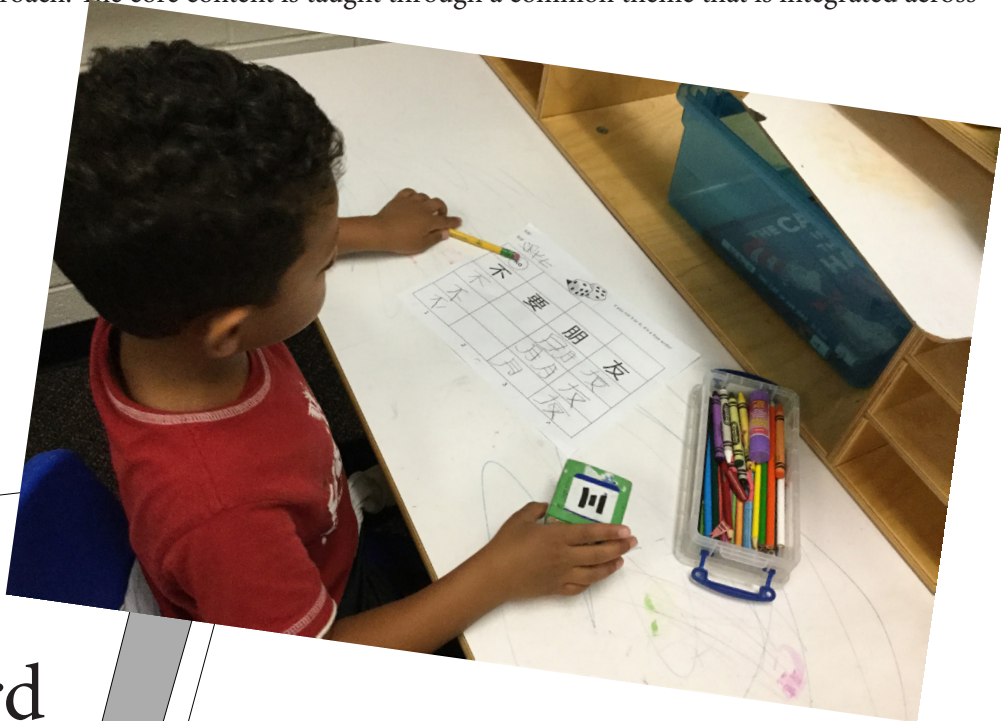
